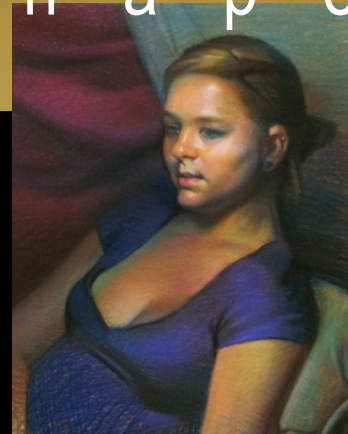
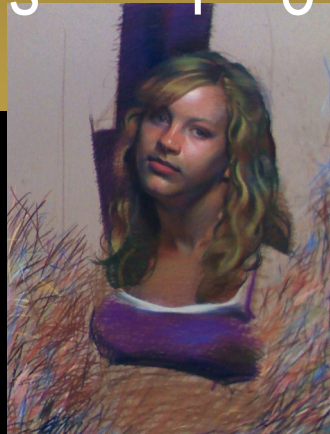
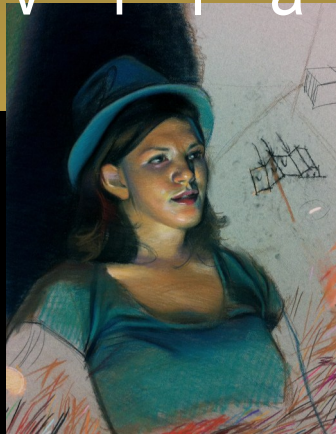

- Felt Gray (or Steel Gray, if Felt Gray is not available) shade, 19 x 25 inch, Canson Mi-Teintes drawing papers only (about 8 sheets).
- Drawing board (preferably a simple masonite board) to hold 19 x 25 inch paper (one board per participant).
- One roll of masking tape
- Prismacolor brand **NuPastel** 36 Color Sets only (one box per participant)
- Kneaded eraser (one piece per participant)
- One HB charcoal pencil and one 2B charcoal pencil
- One yardstick (cost 61 cents at Home Depot)
- A tackle box like case to carry supplies (optional)
